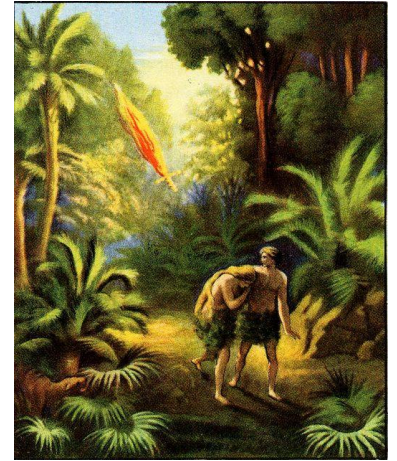

Reading: Psalm 104: 1-19

¹ Bless the Lord, O my soul. O Lord my God, you are very great. You are clothed with honor and majesty, ² wrapped in light as with a garment. You stretch out the heavens like a tent, ³ you set the beams of your chambers on the waters, you make the clouds your chariot,

you ride on the wings of the wind, ⁴ you make the winds
your messengers, fire and flame your ministers. ⁵ You set the earth on its
foundations, so that it shall never be shaken. ⁶ You cover it with the deep
as with a garment; the waters stood above the mountains.
⁷ At your rebuke they flee; at the sound of your thunder they take to
flight. ⁸ They rose up to the mountains, ran down to the valleys to the
place that you appointed for them. ⁹ You set a boundary that they may
not pass, so that they might not again cover the earth. ¹⁰ You make
springs gush forth in the valleys; they flow between the hills, ¹¹ giving
drink to every wild animal; the wild asses quench their thirst.
¹² By the streams the birds of the air have their habitation; they sing
among the branches ¹³ From your lofty abode you water the mountains;
the earth is satisfied with the fruit of your work. ¹⁴ You cause the grass
to grow for the cattle, and plants for people to use, to bring forth food
from the earth ¹⁵ and wine to gladden the human heart, oil to make the
face shine, and bread to strengthen the human heart. ¹⁶ The trees of
the Lord are watered abundantly, the cedars of Lebanon that he
planted. ¹⁷ In them the birds build their nests; the stork has its home in
the fir trees. ¹⁸ The high mountains are for the wild goats; the rocks are a
refuge for the coney. ¹⁹ You have made the moon to mark the seasons;
the sun knows its time for setting.
